- 2 All students will have at least one snack break at a stipulated time every day. Students are strongly encouraged to pack dry finger foods, e.g. fruit, bread, biscuits, as well as wet wipes / tissue papers to clean up.
- 3 SDR School-based Dyslexia Remediation and RRP Reading Remediation Programme: As these programmes involve a small group of students, they will start immediately after school dismissal, with a snack break incorporated into the lesson. HMTL Higher Mother Tongue Language Lessons. Students will be given a short lunch break prior to lessons
- 4 Remedial is a class-based support programme for <u>selected</u> students conducted by the subject teachers. Notification letter (via Parents Gateway) will be issued by subject teachers.

- 1 Morning Reading Programme: Students are required to bring a story book or recommended reading material. [Mon to Wed: English Language books; Thu & Fri: Mother Tongue Language books]
- 2 All students will have at least one snack break at a stipulated time every day. Students are strongly encouraged to pack dry finger foods, e.g. fruit, bread, biscuits, as well as wet wipes / tissue papers to clean up.
- 3 HMTL Higher Mother Tongue Language Lessons. Students will be given a short lunch break prior to lessons
- 4 Remedial is a class-based support programme for <u>selected</u> students conducted by the subject teachers. Notification letter (via Parents Gateway) will be issued by subject teachers.
- Student Development Experiences (SDEs) such as student leadership development programmes and other enrichment programmes (e.g. E2K trainings), will <u>generally</u> be held on Tuesdays. Information on these individual programmes will be given through the registration forms.
- 6 CCA sessions in school will start at 2.15 pm on Fridays. Sports CCA trainings will run from 2.15 to 3.45 pm. Performing Arts CCAs will run from 2.15 to 4.15 pm.

 Should CCA Sessions be pivoted online via Zoom, the sessions will run from 3.00 to 4.30 pm.

5. Home-School Partnership

Advisories on Crime, Drug/Inhalant abuse and Vaping

The above organisations have jointly provided an advisory to remind students to stay away from crime and drug/inhalant abuse, as well as to take measures to prevent themselves from becoming victims of crime during the coming school holidays. In addition, the HPB and HSA have also provided an advisory to remind students of the harmful effects of vaping and that it is illegal, regardless of age. Please refer to the advisories attached.

6. Administrative Matters

Traffic Management, Arrival and Dismissal of Students

Parents are strongly discouraged from alighting or picking up their children outside the school gate near the pedestrian crossing, to avoid traffic congestion along Tanglin Halt Road. This poses a danger to students using the pedestrian crossing from cars negotiating around your parked cars.

With effect from Tuesday, 1 November 2022, parents may drive into the school to alight students at the foyer between 6.45 to 7.30 a.m. Parents must follow the directions provided by the traffic wardens.

All gates are closed till dismissal time. Parents are advised to wait for their children outside the school (at Gate 1) and at the Parent Waiting Area at Gate 2 and at Gate 3. The front and back gates are opened for half an hour after dismissal time. For safety reasons, parents are not allowed into the school for the first ten minutes of the school dismissal. Parents who drive may enter the school to pick up their children after the school buses have left the school grounds¹ (approximately 20 minutes after dismissal time).

¹The school main gate will be open for about 30 minutes after dismissal time for parents to drive into the school, e.g., from 2.00pm - 2.30pm if the dismissal time is 1.40pm. Should parents arrive early before the school gates are open, do not stop along the side of the road as this will create traffic congestion.

School Uniform and Attire

Every student must be neatly attired and wear their prescribed school uniform with pride. **Modification to the school uniform is not allowed**.

Students can come to school in their Physical Education (PE) attire on days with PAL and/or PE lessons. Students may wear a **plain black or navy-blue** outer wear such as a windbreaker, sweater or cardigan in the morning. The length of their outer wear should not go beyond the hip.

7. School Reopening in 2023

The reopening of schools in 2023 will be staggered for all children in primary schools.

First Day of School for Primary 1 students in 2023

Primary 1 students will report to school on **Tuesday, 3 January 2023**. A Primary 1 student will be allowed to be accompanied by only **one** parent / guardian to help their child/ward adjust to new routines and environment.

First Day of School for Primary 2 to 6 students in 2023

Primary 2 to 6 students will report to school on **Wednesday**, **4 January 2023**. Do ensure that your child / ward comes with packed snacks for their snack break on the first day of school. Flag-raising will commence at 7.30 a.m. and students who are not with their form classes during flag-raising ceremony will be considered late.

On subsequent days, all students are encouraged to be with their form classes by 7.15 a.m. for Morning Programme (Reading Programme and Morning Connect). Flag-raising will commence at 7.30 a.m. every morning. This will allow students to ease into the class routines at the start of the day and learning can begin promptly.

Student Health and Well-being

Although Safe Management Measures have been further relaxed, parents should continue to be vigilant and continue to have your children exercise personal hygiene and social responsibility e.g., children not to report to school if unwell when school resumes.

The school will conduct the Temperature-Taking Exercise (TTEx) conducted twice yearly as we aim to:

- a. maintain schools' preparedness to re-activate temperature-taking regime should there be a need to, and
- b. educate students to take personal responsibility for their own health and practise social responsibility.

The first TTEx will be conducted on **Wednesday**, **11 January 2023**. Students are to bring their oral thermometer for the exercise.
